

Minutes of the Clark Borough meeting – June 9, 2026 6:00PM

The meeting of Clark Borough Council was called to order by council President Jim Carucci who led in the pledge to the flag on Tuesday June 9, 2026 at 6:00 p.m. Others in attendance were Clark Eberhart, Alesha Culp, Jason Engstrom, Maryjo Harakal, Monica Simko, Gregg and Lisa Sanford, Sandee and Chris Winslow, Attorney Tara Rodrigues and Chief Adam Piccirillo.

Jason Engstrom made a motion to accept May minutes as read. This motion was seconded by Alesha Culp and passed with all present voting yes.

Jim Carucci read the Treasurer's Report for the month of May. Jason Engstrom made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. The motion was seconded by Clark Eberhart and passed with all present voting yes.

Visitors: Ron Sanford, Cyndi Selby, Carl Hoover, Nicholas Selby.

Unfinished Business:

Sandee Winslow met with the parks & rec committee regarding the retention pond on 6/8/26. Stone will be added to the pond to eliminate the standing water. The only cost would be for the stone materials.

Sandee Winslow stated that she is putting the bids out to advertise for the Ball Field project on 6/16/26 and 6/22/26. The bids will be opened on July 6, 2026 at 1:01pm.

Ken Mattocks asked to move forward with the fence to keep renters from entering his private property. Lowes to come re-quote.

Maryjo Harakal received a quote to install snow guards from KES Construction. Jim Carucci made a motion to install individual guards between the grooves on the roof in the amount of \$3,216.00 leaving no future roofing issues as their responsibility. The motion was seconded by Alesha Culp and passed with a roll call vote of Jim Carucci – Yes, Doug Robbins – Yes, Clark Eberhart – Yes, Carol Houck – Yes, Alesha Culp – Yes.

Dave Wilson asked for 3 more weeks to clean up the property at 32 McMinn due to health issues. Jason Engstrom made a motion to approve more time and send a certified letter to have the grass mowed. The motion was seconded by Clark Eberhart and passed with all present voting yes.

New Business:

Jim Carucci made a motion to post the yard sale dates at the post office.

Ordinance I-1981 needs to be updated to increase fees and change/add verbiage. Attorney Rodrigues stated to get her the updates and she'll draft a new ordinance.

Correspondence:

Council requested thoughts and prayers to the Esmond family due to losing their grandchildren in the Sharon house fire.

Officials & Committees:

Sewer:

Clark Eberhart read the Sewer bills for the month of June. Clark Eberhart made a motion to pay sewer bills as read. The motion was seconded by Jason Engstrom and passed with all present voting yes.

Fire:

Maryjo Harakal read the Fire Report for the Month of May. Jason Engstrom made a motion to accept the Fire report as read. The motion was seconded by Jim Carucci and passed with all present voting yes.

Attorney Rodrigues provided a memorandum to review based on changes she would recommend for the Fire agreement due to vagueness in certain areas. Maryjo Harakal had talked with Gary Hinkson regarding the 2026 fee and that it should be prorated since it is already June. Attorney Rodrigues stated that Clark Borough does not need to put the merge out to vote with the community as it is a contracted service. Council agreed with all points provided in the memorandum and asked Attorney Rodrigues to draft a new letter and send to Chief Wadlow for review.

Ron and Gregg Sanford requested to have a copy of the original contract. Attorney Rodrigue did not feel that to be necessary until changes are made and then could provide a copy to the CVFC prior to decisions.

Police:

Maryjo Harakal read the Police Report for the Month of May. Jim Carucci made a motion to accept the Fire report as read. The motion was seconded by Jason Engstrom and passed with all present voting yes.

Buildings, Parks & Rec:

Council expressed a Thank You to Jim Miller and Clark Eberhart and Pete Misivich for the yard repair.

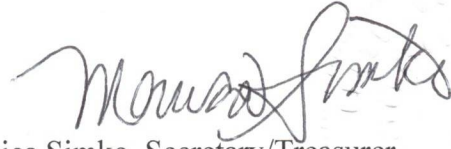
